MRI UPGRADE OFFERS FASTER & EXCEPTIONALLY CLEAR SCANS

B ecause our patients are literally the reason for the hospital's existence, we are continually driven to improve our equipment, our services, and everything leading to the best patient experience possible. For this reason, we recently upgraded our MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) machine, the Canon Vantage Orian Encore, adding new software that effectively provides the equivalent clarity of a 3T magnet.

"Images are sharper and provide improved diagnostic capabilities for our providers, which means improved selection of treatment options for our patients," said Wyatt Brieser, VP of Operations. "The MRI also has improved technologist controls to more accurately reproduce images in the same plane and assure physician and patient image needs are met."

Scans are now faster and much clearer. Brain scans, for example, can be effectively completed in about a half-hour. As a matter of fact, almost every scan at Hammond-Henry can be effectively and thoroughly completed in about 30 minutes.

"Due to improved workflow efficiency and equipment function, the time a patient is in the MRI opening is reduced by 25-50%," Brieser said. "For someone in pain, this is a significant improvement compared to other equipment with lesser MRI products." Additionally, the Vantage Orian Encore provides enhanced patient comfort with a larger opening (71 centimeters). This offers some relief to patients who experience claustrophobia or other anxious tendencies or require more space for correct positioning.

"Another important item to consider is wait times at Hammond-Henry are significantly reduced compared to other places," said Justin Frank, Imaging Department Manager. "We can get you in for testing in days versus weeks. Once you're here, you will have technologists who will treat you like family. Your comfort, in every aspect, is just as important to us as the technology and results are."

'They Were *There* for Me'

HAMMOND-HENRY PROVIDES A COMPASSIONATE MRI EXPERIENCE

C laustrophobic or not, spending time in enclosed spaces makes many anxious. And when your doctor orders an MRI, you want to go where you'll feel as comfortable physically as you will emotionally. That's why Mitchel White chose Hammond-Henry Hospital for his testing.

"Being a man of almost 400 pounds, I was concerned about fitting into the tube," said White, a 33-year-old Osco resident who's been a patient of Dr. Maxhn McCaw since he was born. "I have a herniated disk and knew this test might be uncomfortable. It wasn't difficult at all."

The 25-minute test required White to enter the tube feet first and cross his arms on his chest going in. "The table is adjusted to the height you need to sit on it, and then it's raised to go into the machine. Simple as that. The techs helping you are also good about making sure you know exactly what is happening and how long it will take." Technologists communicate through headphones while patients are in the MRI. To ease comfort, a soft, blue light shines inside the opening and headphones are given to the patient to dim ambient noise.

"I'd like to say whether the blue light was helpful, but I just closed my eyes in there and relaxed, which itself says something. They let me pick out the genre of music I got to listen to, so the time was spent listening to classic rock," he said.

"It's nice having this hometown hospital here so I don't have to travel all the way to the Quad Cities. Plus, the people caring for me were so kind. I'm a big guy and when I got up, they were there for me. No rush to get up, just whatever I needed to get off the table and on my way. I would rate my experience as a 10/10."
