2021 HHH Auxiliary Contributions Scholarships and Equipment

The Auxiliary provided a **total of \$20,250** in scholarships that were awarded to 19 local students studying health careers. Five are CNA students taking a dual enrollment class in conjunction with local high schools and Blackhawk College.


