Highlights of this trip include: Toronto, Niagara Falls, Niagara-on-the-Lake, Thousand Islands National Park, Ottawa, Quebec City, Choice on Tour, Montmorency Falls, Maple Sugar Shack, Montreal. Niagara Falls is an awe-inspiring set of waterfalls along the border between Canada and the US. We also visit Niagara-on-the-Lake, which some call the "loveliest town in Canada".

Highlights of this trip include: Mission San José, The Alamo, El Mercado, Paseo del Rio Cruise, Fredericksburg, National Museum of the Pacific War, Choice on Tour, Historic Pearl District. Along the San Antonio River sit five Spanish colonial era Catholic missions. Because of the missions' historic and cultural significance, in 2015 they were named a UNESCO World Heritage site. It is the first site in Texas to receive this designation and one of only twenty-three in all of the US.

We are staying all four nights in the same hotel, the Westin Riverwalk Hotel.
