Hammond-Henry Hospital has been awarded a 5-Star Rating for Patient Experience. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) star rating scores hospitals on a one-to-five-star scale based on the 10 publicly reported measures in the Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS) survey, which assesses patient experiences collected from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019. The survey is administered to a random sample of adult patients across all types of medical conditions between 48 hours and six weeks post-discharge. Surveys are not restricted to Medicare beneficiaries. To receive a rating, hospitals must have received at least 100 completed HCAHPS surveys over a given four-quarter period and be eligible for public reporting of the measures. CMS publishes these star ratings on Compare Hospital at medicare.gov/ hospitalcompare to help patients when choosing a hospital. In addition, Hammond-Henry Hospitals Long Term Care Living Center (LTC) has been CMS 5-Star for the past eight (8) years.
