Volunteer Training

A Volunteer Training will be held on **Tuesday, February 19**, **1:30 p.m.** in the first floor conference room at HHH. <u>Please call the volunteer office 944-9130 if you plan to attend.</u>

This training is for all new volunteers. All current volunteers are required to attend a training once every two years and this session will meet that requirement.

Topics covered in the training include confidentiality, hospital safety codes, emergency procedures, infection control, wheelchair safety, and behavioral standards.

There will be a training especially for Gift Shop volunteers later in the spring.

Volunteer Opportunities

musical programs or other special entertainment.

Read to a resident with limited vision

a city tour of San Francisco.


You will see the Willamette Valley—

Message from Mark

Hammond-Henry has always been committed to providing excellence in healthcare; it's in our mission statement. But when our hospital received ISO 9001 certification in late 2018, it was a reminder that we must also live our mission.

The International Organization for Standardization, or ISO, was founded in 1947 and much like Hammond-Henry, has been around for many years. During its first 60 years, it was primarily tailored to international military and manufacturing industries and called for consistent work processes with documentation on how to perform "standard" processes.

The current version, ISO 9001, is more generic and includes process improvement measures for many diverse sectors, including assisting hospitals and their medical staff deliver high quality, patient-centered healthcare. How does it accomplish this important task? Ultimately, the goal is to remove variation, so that critical work processes are done consistently and the "best ideas" aren't just held by one person or one department, but are engrained and followed organization-wide.

As part of our compliance and improvement efforts, we work hard to help staff create clear and consistent work processes to deliver exceptional patient care and to ensure that progress and improvement is deliberate and measured. ISO certification is also a sign to our community, insurers and regulatory agencies that we are actively committed to and pursuing quality healthcare, with discipline, consistency and transparency. The principles of ISO provide a wedge that keeps us always moving forward.

As one of only thirty-four critical access hospitals (2%) in the nation and one of fourteen of all hospitals in Illinois (2%) to receive this certification, we are proud to have the acknowledgment and validation, but mostly the satisfaction that we participate in a method to make excellence and safety an everyday objective.
