Measles Immunity—Proof Required

With the current measles outbreaks, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) now requires proof of measles immunity for hospital staff and volunteers.

For volunteers born in 1957 or before, you do not need to provide proof of measles immunity.

For volunteers born in 1958 or after, I need a copy of MMR immunization documentation from a doctor or from your school record. If you do not have record of MMR 1 and 2 (or having had the measles) you will need to have a Rubeola titer to check immunity. This is a simple blood draw that can be done at HHH at no charge to you. Please check with Julie West if you need to have this done. (This is not a fasting blood test.)

If you were born in 1985 or after (includes Junior Volunteers) your high school will have your immunization records and you can request a copy.

Emergency Department Renovation

September 17 marked the 191st day into the ED renovation, with Phase 2 (the west section) now complete. The request for IDPH approval was sent August 30 and IDPH has 30 days to complete their review and issue occupancy.

Emergency back-lit external signage has been installed near the Main Entrance and a donor open house celebration was held on September 5, with three special wall features completed by Village Home Stores.

Since construction began in March, the average wait-to-triage time is 3 minutes and no patient diversions have occurred. Our patient satisfaction scores from May thru July were at 91.1%.

We are hopeful to occupy the new space (west section) shortly, then complete Phase 3 (the east section) and project by year end. We appreciate everyone's patience and support throughout the project and look forward to the improvements to better serve our patients.
